





CROP CONDITIONS:
Wheat emergence and growth has generally been average to good throughout the Central Plains as of early November — much more so than the past two years at this time. In fact, growth may be too lush and big in some areas. Big wheat in the fall sets up a lot of soil moisture and often becomes susceptible to drought stress in the spring unless rainfall is good. Big lush wheat is also more susceptible to spring freeze injury. It would be best for big wheat to be grazed, if possible, to hold it back a little. Ideally, wheat will go into winter with 2-3 healthy tillers and a good secondary root system.


